

Don't delay the fun-belay your rope and climb the 40-foot rock wall at Rock Climb Fairfield located in Fairfield. Connecticut's largest indoor climbing gym welcomes all ages to try more than 100 top rope stations, ice climbing and thousands of square feet of bouldering. With multiple zip lines, obstacles and swings to navigate at Go Ape Treetop Adventure course in New Britain, visitors take the excitement outside for a monkey'seye view of the amazing countryside.

Several indoor trampoline parks throughout the state offer more unleashed adventures. Travel to Trumbull's Rockin' Jump to show off your somersaults in open jump arenas or sink into pools of soft foam cubes. At Launch Trampoline Park in Hartford, the trampoline dodgeball tournaments get extreme.

In New Britain, Flight Trampoline Park recently introduced slacklines for bettering your balance, as well as multilevel basketball hoops.

The R/V Spirit of the Sound—a catamaran operated by the Maritime Aquarium at Norwalk-offers public cruises, including seal spotting, bird and lighthouse cruises. 
REFRESH + **REFUEL**

Lenny & Joe's Fish Tale in Madison serves up a side order of fun to the local community. Hop on a handmade Dentzel Carousel animal-the menagerie includes a hippo, frog, giraffe, lion and a double lobster chariot-and your \$1.50 ride goes to charity. It's raised nearly \$850,000 since its first go-round 15 years ago.

Each summer, a benefit series of ten Dinners at the Farm are served under tents at Barberry Hill Farm in Madison and White Gate Farm in East Lyme. Beginning with a farm tour, these six-course.



candlelit dinners showcase ingredients sourced and purchased daily from local farmers, ranchers and fishermen. Over the past eight seasons, more than 100 dinners have raised \$120,000 for nonprofit organizations such as local food pantries and school kitchens.



As the largest resort casino in North America, Foxwoods Resort Casino offers an all-in-one getaway. Your first step: select a hotel. Do you want Four-Diamond luxury? Try the Grand Pequot Tower, the Fox Tower or The Villas at Foxwoods with 24-hour butler service. The Great Cedar Hotel offers spacious comfort with an unbeatable location, while the Two Trees Inn provides a quieter country inn escape.

Are you placing bets on baccarat, bingo, or blackjack? With six casinos, 5,800 slot machines and 350 table games, newcomers can start slow at the Money Wheel. For an adrenaline boost, buy in to a Sit & Go tournament in the east coast's largest poker room.

You can also have the time of your life without wagering. Outside, play 18 rounds on the Lake of Isles championship golf course designed by Rees Jones. Take a history break at the Mashantucket Pequot Museum, which









preserves the culture of the area's first inhabitants. Shop at Tanger Outlets-80 premium retailers all under one

roof. Relax with a caviar facial at the Norwich Spa, or a Native Americaninspired maize and mountain laurel scrub at the G-Spa.

Repeat visitors know to pace themselves for the nightlife. It begins with dinner, from the classic and casual Hard Rock Café to the Four-Diamond Paragon. Next up: bowling at the retro-chic High Rollers alley, a comedy show at Comix or dancing at Shrine Nightclub. > Two more intimate venues, the Cabaret Theatre and the Wolf Den, bring in both emerging and established performers.

After the show, your night is far from over. Grab a nightcap

or go dancing in one of Mohegan Sun's clubs, bars and lounges, such as Vista, Mist,

Avalon Nightclub, Lansdowne Irish Pub or Jimmy Buffett's Margaritaville. 🚨
